

MEMORIAL DAY PARADE INFORMATION 2020

Rules:

- Morning of the parade help will be located at the corner of Throckmorton Ave and Olive st. if you forget your assignment.
- The parade stages between 8:30 AM and 10 AM. Parade starts at 10:30am
- All entrants must supply own transportation, driver, clean up, and decorations.
- We will organize the parade using the information you give us on your application.

Parade Etiquette:

- Follow all directions of official parade marshals and police officers.
- To reduce the accordion effect and eliminate the historically huge gaps in the parade, marshals along the route will direct your entry to stop and start to keep the flow constant. Be cool and help out.
- Keep moving, if you stop to do a performance at Lytton Square, keep it 1 minute or less and move along.
- DO NOT STOP during any other point in the parade to do a performance, or karate moves, or tell a joke – perform while you keep marching
- Stay no more than 20 feet behind the entry in front of you in the parade.

Candy:

NOTE: There will be no throwing of candy (or anything else) from the parade floats or vehicles allowed

- You may use walking members of your group to hand out candy
- To avoid little kids getting run over, or wrestling with bigger kids over candy on the street, please have your walkers put the candy into their hands, **DO NOT THROW IT.**
- To avoid slip and fall injury to our equestrian and walking entries – **LEAVE NO CANDY ON THE STREET**
